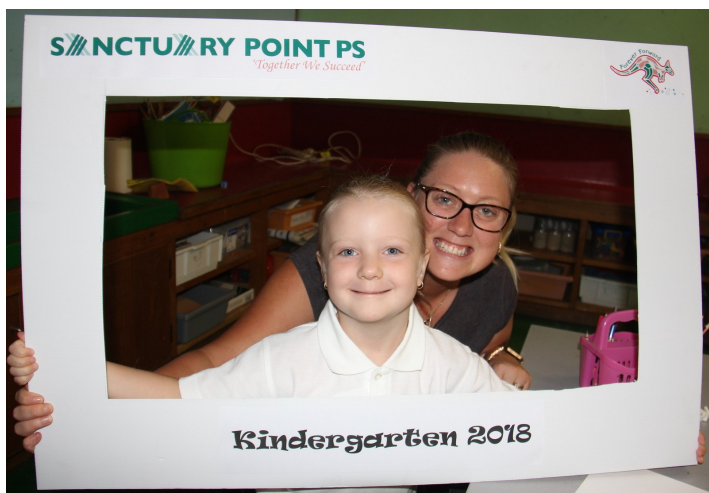
MEET AND GREET

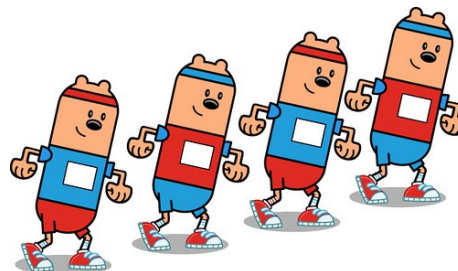

'Blast Off' Reward Program.

Where you need to be a star, to earn a star!

The purpose of this whole school reward system is to acknowledge and promote the existing individual student responsibilities under one positive reinforcement program. Our schools 'Blast Off' program focuses on the five 'Star Values'

Communication
Problem solving
Learning
Movement
Safety

How the program works:

Each student has the opportunity to gain 3 stars a week:

1. If the child is at school on time every day for the week they get a star
2. If the child has not had their name on the board in the week - so they consistently follow class rules and behave they get a star
3. If the child has completed their classwork for the week they get a star

There are posters in every classroom to remind students of the values and how they can achieve stars.

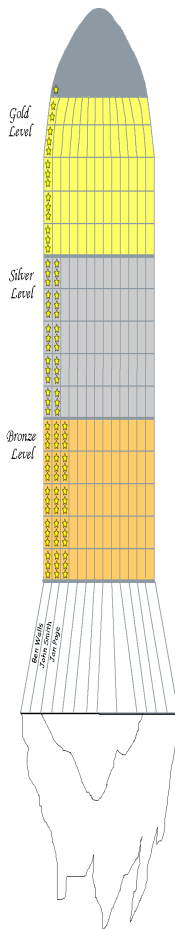
When students reach Bronze and Silver level, their name is published in the newsletter and they receive their certificate from their class teacher.

We acknowledge it is important to reward all efforts and progress however; students need to be responsible for their own behaviour. Therefore, if students receive a detention, they will lose 3 stars of their Blast Off chart.

Over the upcoming weeks we will be looking at these 5 values in more detail and considering how they look in the classroom, playground and the community.

Teachers will assist students to understand these values by demonstrating and highlighting behaviours that are consistent with the 'Star Values'. Next week our focus is Communication.

There are a few ways you can do this..

◆ A written note to the class teacher

Stating:

- Your child's full name,
- The date they were away
- The reason they were not at school
- Your signature and the date

◆ Using the Skoolbag App

- ◆ Using your smartphone open the App and click 'eForms'
- ◆ Choose 'Absentee Form' and fill in your child's details.

◆ Phone the school if your child is not at school for 2 days in a row.

- ◆ A written note should still be sent to school with your child, along with a Dr. Certificate where appropriate.

Celebrate Attendance

Hints and Tips No 1: Responsibilities



Parent/s or caregivers are required – by law – to provide a written or verbal explanation to the Principal within seven days of any absence as to why their child was not at school.

It is important that the school receives a written or verbal explanation because:

- (1) It is a parent's legal obligation to explain their child's absence within seven days
- (2) It is a requirement that the school investigate all unexplained absences
- (3) It avoids the school and the School Attendance Officer from making unnecessary investigations
- (4) It is the way the school knows that your child was legitimately absent and not truanting from school

If you have any difficulties in providing a written explanation for your child's absence, please contact your school principal.



Missing school leaves gaps in your education

Any absence that is not due to illness, or leave approved by the principal will normally be marked as 'unjustified'.

Students who have less than 90% attendance will be contacted by school to discuss how to improve your child's attendance.

The simplest way

...to make zucchini and corn fritters

Ingredients

2 zucchinis, grated & liquid squeezed out
1 cup frozen or canned corn kernels
1 cup red capsicum, finely diced
4 eggs
½ cup grated Parmesan cheese
½ cup chopped, fresh dill
6 tbsp wholemeal flour
Olive oil spray



Method

1. Place the zucchini, corn, capsicum, eggs, Parmesan, dill and flour in a bowl. Mix well.
2. Spray a large fry pan with olive oil and heat over a medium heat. Working in batches, fill an ice-cream scoop (or large spoon) with the mixture and drop onto the pan. Flatten the fritters out slightly with a fork. Cook for approximately 4 minutes or until brown, flip and continue to cook until that side is brown and cooked through.

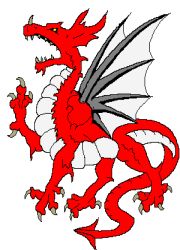
