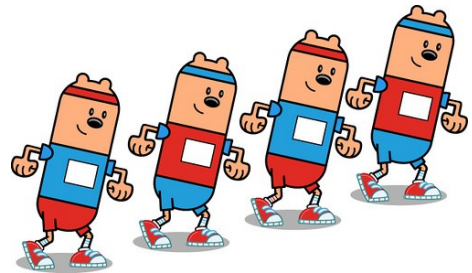

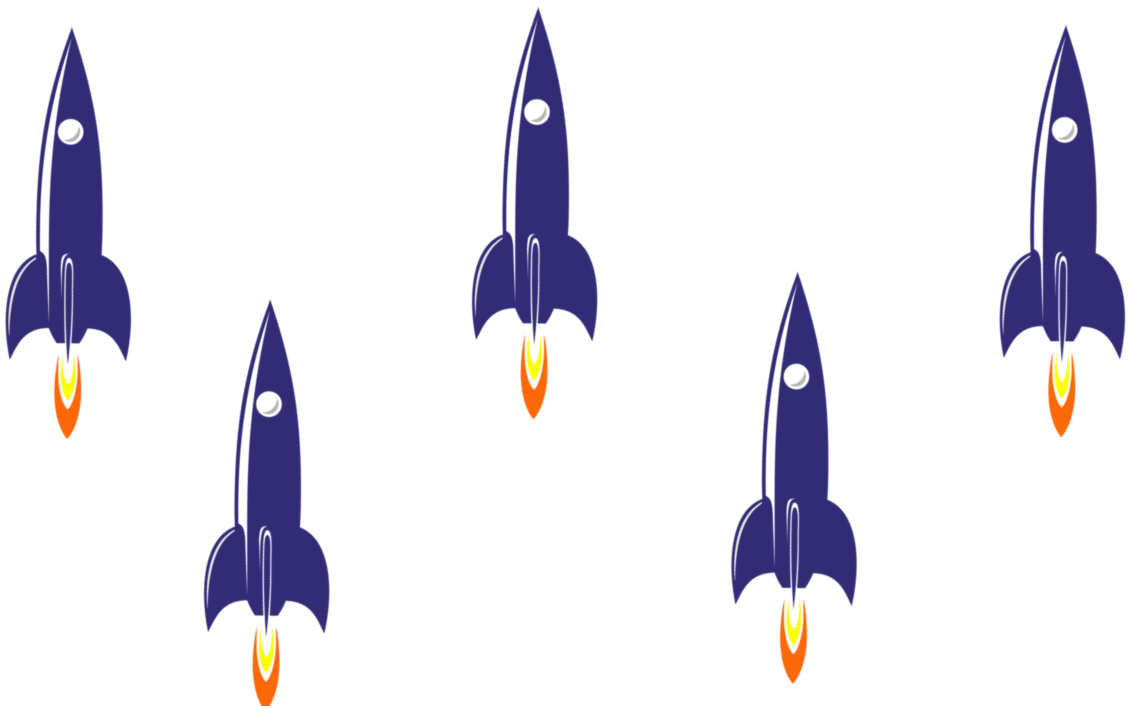

As we are heading towards the seventh National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence on Friday the 16th of March 2018, we are focusing on the No Bullying unit of the Bounce Back Program. It links in beautifully with our 'No Bullying unit' this term as bullies are bucket dippers.

Kinder will focus on understating that bullying is being mean and unkind to someone over days, or weeks or longer. Bullies will often say, write text or do mean things that hurt the other person's body, feelings or possessions. Bullying is not having an argument or if someone does something mean or nasty. Understanding the difference is paramount to assist us with knowing how to deal with the situation.

Kindergarten's Picnic in the Playground



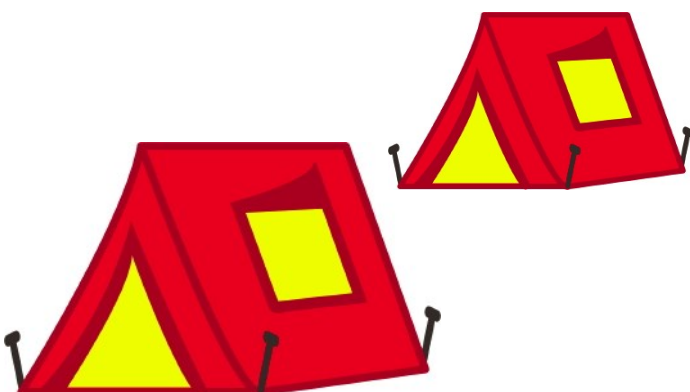

We want to help **YOU** to get your child to school every day

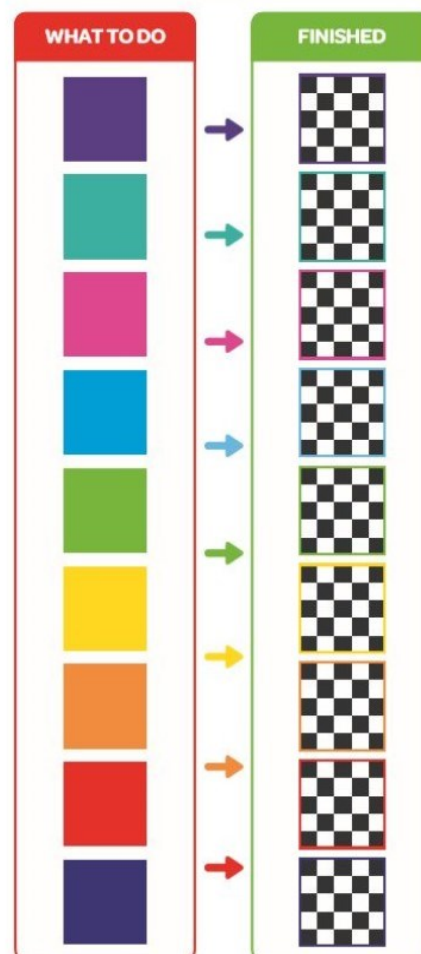
We understand that getting kids to school **ON Time** every day is not always smooth sailing.
