## **Copy for schools updating parents and carers about CCS starting in their school**

Our school has been included in the Connecting Country Schools (CCS) project, which is delivering upgraded wireless connectivity and internet access to more than 900 schools around the state. Planning for installations at our school has commenced with our assigned Technical Officer from the Department's IT Directorate, who are managing this project.

CCS will deliver upgraded and reliable wireless access in all our learning spaces, assisting teachers to deliver future focused learning to prepare our students for digital age jobs.

Improved wireless and internet services will also give students more chances to connect and collaborate and greater access to online knowledge databases, streaming media, educational institutions and experts. We are working with our Technical Officer to ensure that disruptions during the installation are kept to a minimum. External contractors who will visit the school to undertake work are required to have a Working With Children Check.

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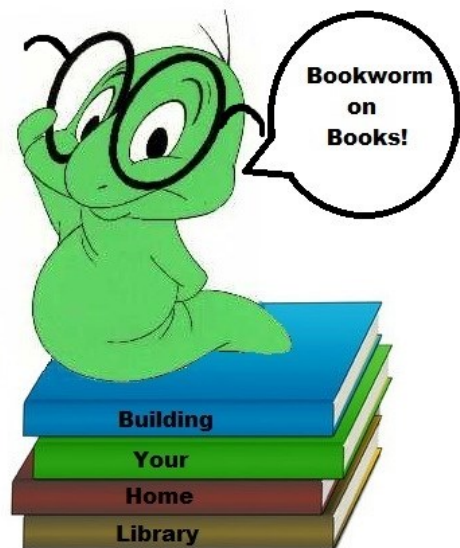
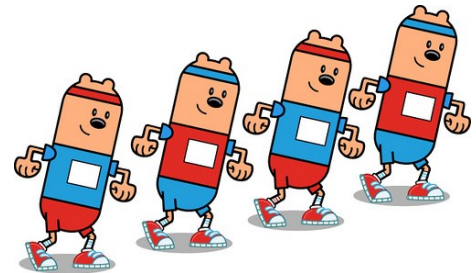

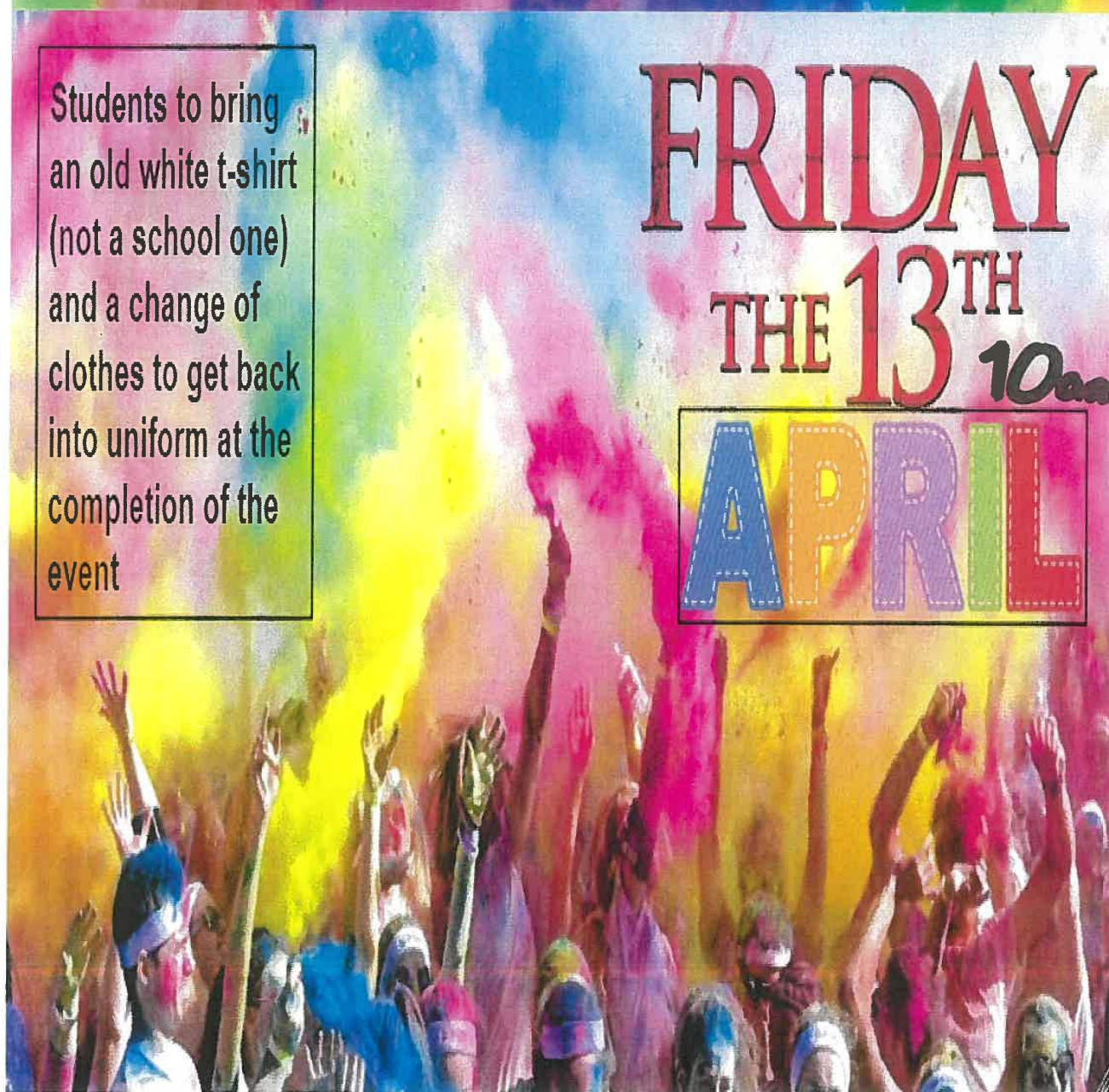

# ART ATTACK



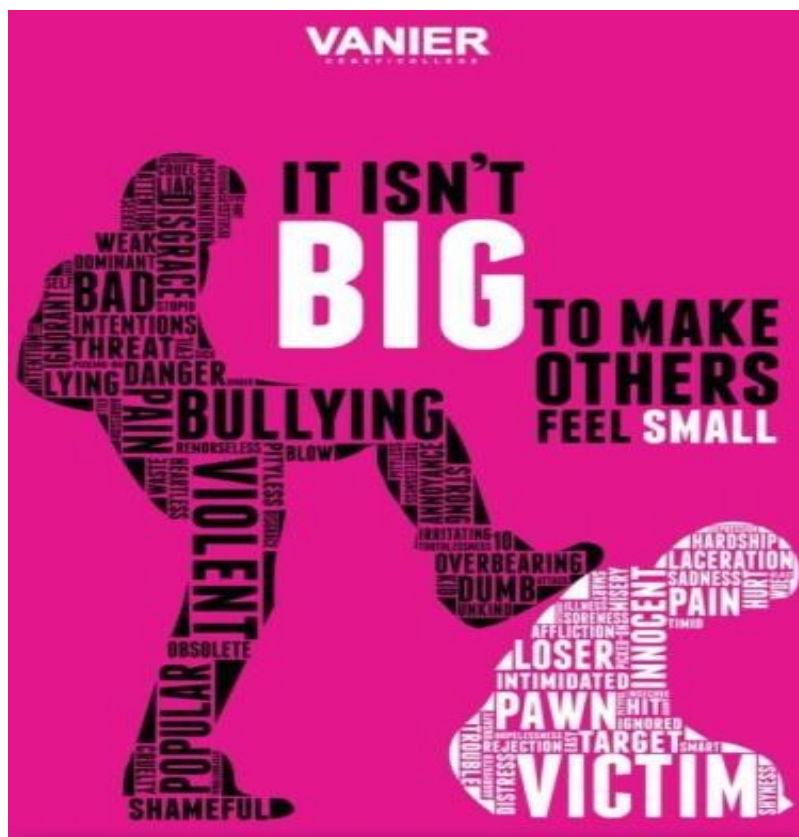

Our school has a commitment to supporting our student's academically, socially and emotionally. We are proud to be a KidsMatter school and as part of this initiative all classes will be teaching the Bounce Back program. This term each class is focusing on no bullying.

**Year 5 and 6 will focus on the understanding that bullying** is world-wide and can be on different platforms. Bullying means deliberately and repeatedly trying to harm or cause distress to another person. Bullying may involve hurting someone physically, calling someone nasty names, humiliating or embarrassing them, spreading rumours about them, playing nasty jokes on them, trying to make sure they are left out or trying to stop others from liking them. Bullying happens face to face, online and through mobile phones. Bullying is unacceptable in our classrooms and in our school because it is unfair and unkind.

Put downs are also unacceptable. A put down is a deliberately mean remark or gesture that tries to belittle someone, make them look small, bad or silly. Students who often bully others could become criminals. It is important to protect yourself against being bullied as much as you can, and you should seek help if you are being bullied or you see bullying occur. The students will learn about the different types of bullying, responding to being bullied and how we can work as a team in school to stop bullying from happening.
