Their ability to organised games was not at the level we would expect. Teachers needed more time to explicitly teach these skills to students. Secondly, because students had 2 terms of leisure sport they seemed to be losing interest and it was becoming harder to fill sports such as surfing and snorkelling. It is hoped that Leisure Sports will now be something to look forward to at the end of the year and the enthusiasm and participation will be high.
