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

Online NAPLAN Trial

A few years ago, federal, state and territory education ministers agreed that NAPLAN will move online over a two-three year period. This means moving NAPLAN from the current paper-based tests to computer-based assessments. NAPLAN Online will provide better assessment, more precise results and faster turnaround of information. Sanctuary Point Public School has previously completed online NAPLAN trials and readiness tests but this is the first year that students will be completing the actual NAPLAN test online starting Tuesday, week 3 and finishing Wednesday, week 4. If your child is in Yr 5 or Yr 3, during week 3 and 4 they will complete a writing, reading, language conventions and numeracy test.
