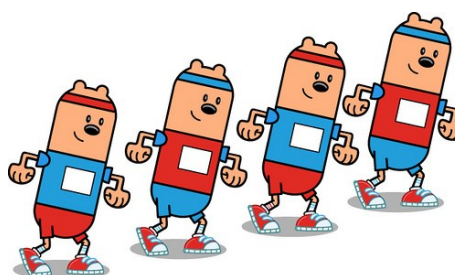
PRIMARY ATHLETICS CARNIVAL

The simplest way

... to make rainbow sushi.

Ingredients (serves 4)

- 1 ½ cups sushi rice
- 4 tbsp sushi vinegar
- 185g can of tuna, drained
- 1 tbsp mayonnaise
- 4 nori sheets (dried seaweed)
- Veg cut into thin strips
 - ½ carrot, ¼ capsicum, ½ raw, peeled beetroot, 5cm cucumber, ½ avocado



Method

Cook rice according to packet instructions. Fluff the rice with a fork and pour over the sushi vinegar. Stir well to combine. Spread the rice on a baking tray to cool. Mix the tuna and mayo together.

Lay a nori sheet on a bamboo sushi mat, shiny side down. With wet fingers, spread ¼ of the rice over ¾ of the sheet, leaving a ¼ of the sheet clear at the end furthest away from you. Place the tuna and veg across the rice. Using the bamboo mat, roll the sushi away from you stopping where the rice ends. Brush some water along the rice free nori and finish rolling, pressing gently to seal. Repeat with the rest of the sheets. Dip a sharp knife in water and cut the sushi into pieces.

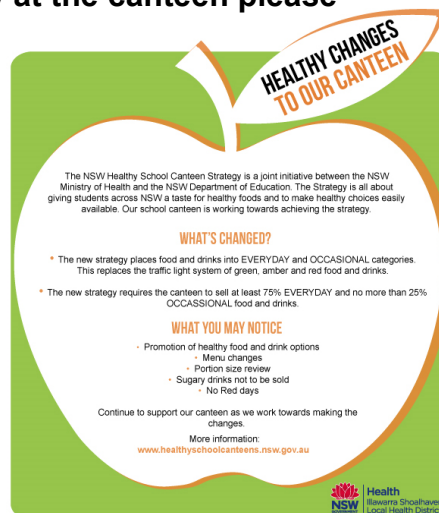

On Thursday the 6th of June the Senior Boys Basketball Team travelled down to Milton Basketball Stadium for their second round game against Milton Public School. The boys were extremely excited upon arrival and cheered on by some very supportive parents who made as much noise as a crowd of hundreds.

The beginning of the first quarter saw both teams showing early game jitters and nerves. The game started off at a very fast pace with both sides struggling to score due to some great team defence. At the end of the first quarter Sanctuary Point were down 5-4. During the second quarter both teams stepped up the intensity and began to get their scoring legs under them with the halftime score being 14-13, with Milton still in the lead. Sanctuary Point's defence kept it close as they were still waiting for the shots to fall. Preston Stewart single handedly kept SPPS in the game by grabbing rebound after rebound on the offensive end which stopped Milton from getting easy fast break points. Tyler Rawlings and Brodie Richards played some excellent one on one defence and caused Milton to turn the ball over multiple times.

At halftime the boys went over their game plan, calmed themselves and made a decision to slow the tempo down. Sanctuary Point's maturity and composure showed immediately by going on a 6 to 2 run to start the third quarter with Brayden Waters and Oliver Driscoll picking up the slack on the offensive end. Joe Lewis provided the crowd with the highlight of the game by cutting into the oppositions passing lane and stealing the ball before sprinting to the hoop, dribbling behind his back and making a great pass for a wide open shot, forcing Milton to foul.

The fourth quarter was a slow paced, low scoring grind with SPPS holding on for a 5 point, 22 to 17 score with Kobie Mitchell hitting the last bucket to secure the win. The sportsmanship, teamwork and persistence of the boys was truly commendable and they proudly represented our school and community the right way. Well done boys, we are all very proud of you. Thank you to the great supporting parents who made the trip, we truly appreciate it and to Milton Public School for organising the venue.

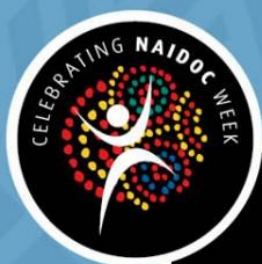
